


Reggae One Drop

(1) One Drop

This is the first step of the 'One Drop' pattern. It shows a eighth-note bass line on the 6th string. Above it, there are four measures of a 'One Drop' drum pattern. Each measure consists of a single eighth-note on the 6th string, followed by a sixteenth-note 'drop' on the 5th string. The 'drop' is indicated by a downward-pointing triangle symbol above the 5th string note. The pattern repeats four times.

(2)

This is the second step of the 'One Drop' pattern. It continues the eighth-note bass line on the 6th string. The drum pattern changes to a 'One Drop' variation. Each measure now consists of a single eighth-note on the 6th string, followed by a sixteenth-note 'drop' on the 4th string. The 'drop' is indicated by a downward-pointing triangle symbol above the 4th string note. The pattern repeats four times.

(3)

This is the third step of the 'One Drop' pattern. It continues the eighth-note bass line on the 6th string. The drum pattern changes again. Each measure now consists of a single eighth-note on the 6th string, followed by a sixteenth-note 'drop' on the 3rd string. The 'drop' is indicated by a downward-pointing triangle symbol above the 3rd string note. The pattern repeats four times.

(4)

This is the fourth and final step of the 'One Drop' pattern. It continues the eighth-note bass line on the 6th string. The drum pattern remains the same as in step 3. Each measure consists of a single eighth-note on the 6th string, followed by a sixteenth-note 'drop' on the 3rd string. The 'drop' is indicated by a downward-pointing triangle symbol above the 3rd string note. The pattern repeats four times.
